# Grease In a Day!

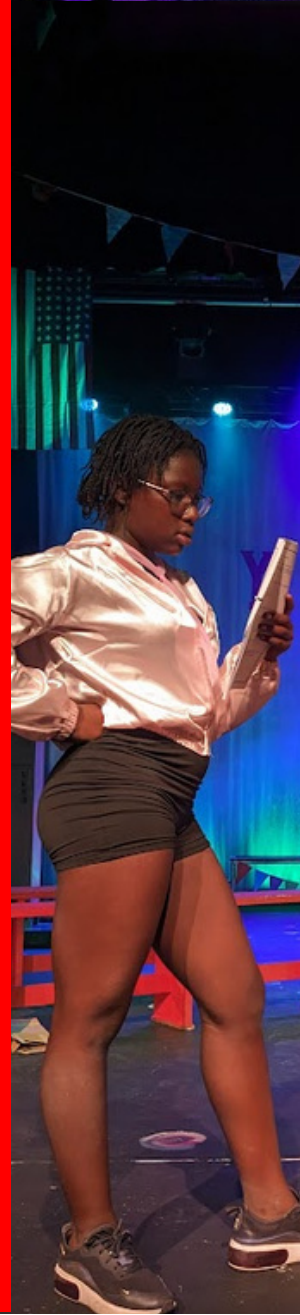

The work was showcased last night in the art department. It was attended by parents who enjoyed the artwork as well as the food!

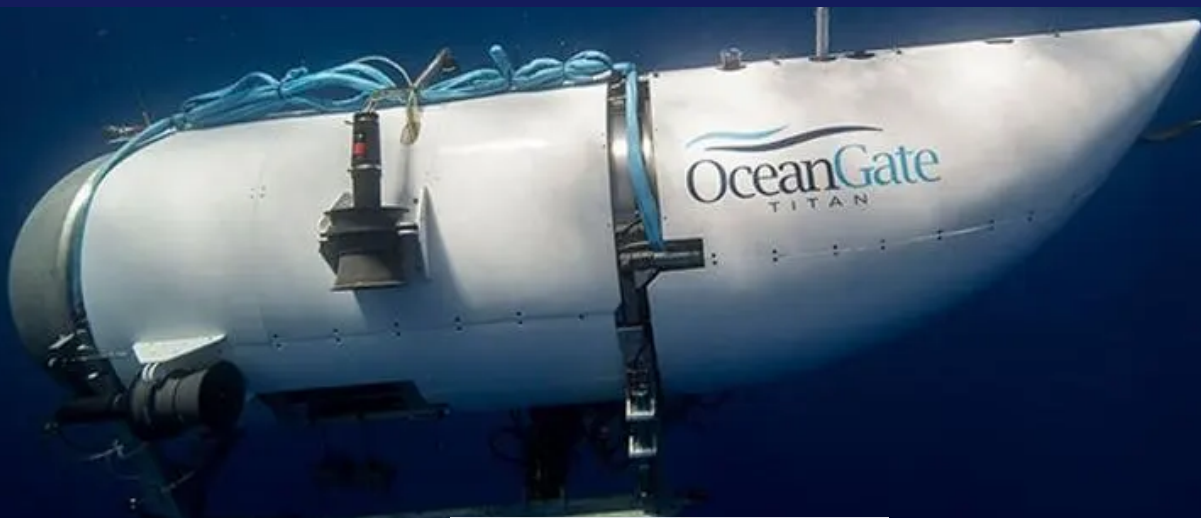
